### **Triduum of Hope**

This year's Triduum of Hope in honour of Mary, Mother of Hope and St Charles will take place from Monday, 27 May to Wednesday, 29 May. The Triduum Mass will be at 10.00 am each day. The evening service of Rosary, Homily and Eucharistic Benediction will be at 7.30 pm. During the Triduum, there will be the usual evening Mass at 6.15 pm. Petitions for the Triduum can be placed in the basket at the back of the church after Mass or handed in at the monastery. Petition forms and offering envelopes are on the tables at the back of the church. Petitions can also be emailed to [office@mountargusparish.ie](mailto:office@mountargusparish.ie) and offerings can be made on the Mount Argus website.

The theme of this year's Triduum is the theme of our Parish Golden Jubilee: 'With gratitude for past blessings, we continue to journey together.' These three days of prayer are an invitation from the Lord to let ourselves be touched by his love and mercy and to experience the loving presence of Jesus Christ who came to heal the broken-hearted. It is a time of grace and healing, a time of renewal in our Christian life, and a special time for remembering all those who have asked for our prayers, especially those who are sick.
